The Village added to its BMP inventory this reporting period. The Village continued to conduct improvement projects within Hendrickson Park at Valley Stream; this included clean up of floatables and channel stabilization efforts that included the addition of 2 ponds and 1 filtration system. The Village's Tree Preservation Code was amended and is summarized as follows; in the event that any tree is removed on curbside/ private property, it may be required to be replaced within twelve (12) months. In the event that the property owner does not desire to plant a replacement tree, it may be required that a fee be paid to the Village's "Green Valley Stream Tree Fund" in which the funds deposited will be used to plant trees elsewhere in the Village.

The Village will continue to follow the BMPs outlined in the NYSDEC Municipal Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Assistance Document as necessary. The Village also plans to conduct self assessments for activities associated with street maintenance and storm sewer system maintenance during the next year. +

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

The Village has chosen to evaluate the number of catch basins inspected, and parking lots and streets swept annually as an indicator for measuring the overall effectiveness of the Village's compliance with the MCM6. Of the Village's 1500 catch basins, 1028 were inspected and cleaned out as necessary in this reporting period. The Village also swept 863 acres of parking lots and 1825 miles of streets. No phosphorus, nitrogen or pesticide/herbicides have been applied to Village property for this period. The Village amended the Tree Preservation Code to ensure tree preservation along curbside areas, and conducted roadway maintenance improvements which included repaving and curb construction to ensure proper drainage.
